

Formby High School has an impressive record of success at GCSE and A Level. In 2012, three quarters of students achieved five A* to C grades (including English and Mathematics) – this significantly exceeds national expectations. Most students join Sixth Form and attain A Level results that enable them to progress to study at some of the country's most prestigious universities. In 2012, 54% of A Levels were graded A* to B which places the school alongside the highest performing in the region.

The school places particular emphasis on the Performing Arts and Science and, through the teaching of these subjects, all students develop creative flair, confidence and enquiring minds that enhance their capacity to learn and enjoy. Students follow a broad curriculum at Key Stage Three and have the opportunity to specialise by choosing from a wide range of GCSE subjects and vocational courses at Key Stage Four.

Formby High School is fully inclusive, offering a curriculum that meets the needs of each individual and enabling every student to succeed.







The uniqueness of every student at Formby High School is valued and the nurturing of each child's talents is at the heart of all we do.

The school places particular importance on pastoral care and personal development, and provides every Year Seven student with the security of being placed in a smaller than average tutor group from the outset. Students retain the same form teacher and Climate for Learning Leader throughout their time at the school and truly benefit from this consistency in terms of care and guidance. Further care is provided by the Climate for Learning Leaders who are assigned to each year group and a committed team of pastoral staff who are based in the Student Support Centre.





Formby High School does not accept second best in terms of standards of behaviour and every student is expected to work hard, respect themself and respect others. The calm and responsible manner in which our students behave promotes a positive learning environment for all.

Students leave Formby High School as young adults equipped with the skills, qualifications, determination and confidence to succeed in life and make a difference to the communities they serve.

Extra-Curricular Programme and School Trips

Students have the opportunity to engage in a wide range of extra-curricular and curriculum enriching activities. The school has a national reputation for excellence in the Performing Ats and all Year Seven students participate in the Christmas pantomime. The school enjoys state-of-the-art drama, dance and music studios which are always a hive of activity at lunchtime and after school, hosting over 20 different music, dance and drama clubs, including Mundo Afrika, G-Force Gospel Choir and dance master classes for all year groups.

All students have the opportunity to follow the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme from Year Nine and there is a variety of physical activities on offer throughout the week with teams from Formby High competing against other schools in a wide range of sports, including football, netball and basketball.





Taking part in activities outside the classroom is a great way for students to build positive relationships, develop self-esteem and lead an active and healthy lifestyle.

The commitment of our students to the extra-curricular programme and the high standards they display demonstrate that the school's mission 'determined to achieve' resonates way beyond their academic work.

Each year, students visit local, national and international places of interest. The range of school trips offered to students is diverse and includes sports tours, cultural visits, Performing Arts tours and field work. In addition to local and national trips to the theatre and museums, students have recently travelled as far afield as the First World War battlefields of France and Belgium, the USA on a ski trip and a Performing Arts tour, the Caribbean for sporting competition and both Spain and France to enhance learning of foreign languages.



The Curriculum and Extra-Curricular Programme



Formby High School offers a dynamic, diverse and inspiring curriculum for students across all year groups. Our provision successfully fuses traditional academic rigour with creative and enterprising opportunities, which aim to prepare our students for exciting and productive futures in an expanding global society. Classroom lessons are enhanced by a series of enrichment activities as part of our Rainbow Day programme, which seeks to challenge students to explore thematic projects in an innovative, cross-curricular way, as well as taking part in educational visits and working with visiting practitioners. Students are also encouraged to develop independent learning and higher-order thinking skills as part of the 'Script for Life' and 'D.I.R.T.' (Dedicated Improvement & Reflection Time) dimensions.

The Key Stage Three curriculum includes a broad range of subjects taught over a two-week timetable.

Sixth Form



We have a flourishing Sixth Form at Formby High with the majority of our Year 11 students returning to us to study A Levels, BTEC qualifications or a combination of these courses. The school offers a wide range of courses which are detailed in the table below. Students in Sixth Form achieve excellent results and many go on to study at some of the country's most prestigious universities. In 2012, two students were successful in gaining places at the University of Cambridge and many more have progressed to study at the Russell Group universities.

Facilities for the Sixth Form are excellent. Students are based in a purpose-built Sixth Form Centre where they have access to a multi-media study facility (equipped with PCs), a common room and Wi-Fi connectivity. Pastoral care is a priority and all students benefit from the guidance of a Form Tutor, Climate for Learning Leader and Learning Mentor, all of whom provide support to enable students to cope with the academic demands of A Level study and prepare well for the university application process.

All students are expected to work hard to make the best of their ability. In Year 12, students typically study four AS Level or equivalent subjects and continue with three of these subjects to A Level during Year 13. We aim, though, to help our students achieve more than just academic success and place a great emphasis on producing articulate, well informed, caring and thoughtful individuals through a comprehensive enrichment programme.

Students have the opportunity to take part in a wide variety of community service and extra-curricular activities. In the past, these have ranged from participation in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme, Peer Mentoring and Paired Reading and in recent years there have been regular trips to the Tate Gallery, the Lake District, the University of Liverpool and Europe's largest indoor climbing centre! The range of enrichment activities has broadened in recent years to give students the opportunity to, amongst other things, produce a fanzine, learn to cook, keep fit and develop safer driving skills!

We provide a two-day programme as part of our induction into Sixth Form and all students have access to use the Sixth Form Common Room at designated times during the school day. Furthermore, students also have a voice on both the Sixth Form and School Councils which offer a forum for lively discussion.

Communication with Parents



We believe that students are more likely to make progress if parents and teachers are all seen to be working together in the best interests of the student. There are many opportunities throughout the school year for parents and the school to be in contact with each other:

- Student Planners which should be checked weekly by parents and where comments can be made by both staff and parents.
- Parents' Evenings when all subject teachers are available for consultation. These are held for each year group in the school and normally take place from 4:30pm to 7:30pm on either a Tuesday or Thursday.
- Year 7 Parent Information Evening and 'Meet the Tutors' afternoon.
- Year 9 Options Interviews parents are invited to attend these interviews with their children to discuss the choice of GCSE subjects.
- **Progress Reports** these are issued termly throughout all key stages to inform parents about the progress students are making towards their target Key Stage 3 National Curriculum levels, GCSE grades or A Level grades.
- Reports full written reports are sent home to all parents once a year.
- Year 11 Support students in Year 11 are interviewed at various times by senior staff and some by the visiting Careers Adviser to discuss progress and future plans. Parents are invited to a Sixth Form Evening to receive information about Sixth Form courses.
- **Website** useful school information, regular updates and copies of correspondence can be found on our school website www.formby.sefton.sch.uk.

Parents are welcome in school at any time if they wish to discuss any matter that is causing concern; however, in the interests of maximising teaching and learning time for your child, we do request that parents call to make an appointment in advance. We may ask parents to come in if we wish to discuss a student's progress or behaviour. We ask parents to monitor homework by signing their daughter/son's planner each week. Parents are informed by sending letters home on a regular basis and a signed reply slip informs us that the letter has been received.

Please be aware that the numbers allocated in each criterion can change from year to year.

Admission Criteria September 2013

Where there are more applications than places available, we will apply the Admissions Criteria in the following order to allocate places:

- 1. Children who are in public care when preferences are expressed and who are expected to still be in public care when they go secondary school.
- 2. Children who have a brother or sister living in the same house who already attend the school as long as they will still be at the school in September 2013⁽¹⁾.
- 3. Children who, at the start of the Spring Term 2013, are on the roll of either Freshfield Primary School, Redgate Primary School or Trinity St. Peter's CE Primary School⁽¹⁾.
- 4. Children who, at the start of the Spring Term 2013, are on the roll of any other primary school in Formby (1).
- 5. Other requests that name the school as a preference (1).

Tie Breaker Clause

(1) If it is not possible to offer places for all applications within any criteria, then priority will be given to those living closest to the school measured by the shortest walking distance from the child's home. We will measure from the property's address point to the nearest school gate (using recognised routes known to the Local Authority at the time of measurement). If you require an explanation of how the distance from your home to school has been measured, please contact the Admissions Team at the Local Authority.
